Faith is trusting in what you can't see because of what you can see.

DAY 1

Read Hebrews 10:23

Have you ever played Tug-of-War at field day? What's the most important thing to do? Don't let go of the rope! But it's not enough to just hold on to the rope. What should you do with your feet? Plant them as firmly as you can! If everyone on your team holds onto the rope, plants their feet, and pulls with all their might, you have a much better chance of winning!

Just like you need teammates to help you win at Tug-of-War, God doesn't expect you to live out your faith on your own. God knows that our faith combined with the faith of others can make an even bigger difference in the world around us. We can hold onto the hope of what Jesus has done for us together because God is faithful and will never let us down.

DAY 2

Read Hebrews 10:24

Read Hebrews 10:25
